MIK Library Electrical Switchgear Upgrade

No.	Question	Answer
1.	There have been issues on past UK projects with the MV feeders running thru the building before hitting the disconnecting means. NEC 230.70(A) (1) is the section of the code that references location. The current layout is approximately 45' inside the building. Please confirm if this is going to be acceptable.	We have contacted the State Electrical Inspector James Burt, we have reviewed the drawings with him and is accepting of the location of the main as shown in drawings. NFPA 70 Allows for this with a documented safe switching letter that we will need to provide working with the UK Medium Voltage Division.
2.	The existing junction box on EP100E is shown to be reused. The box appears to be undersized based on NEC 314.71B. Angle pulls for MV Cable is 36X OD of cable. 15 KV 4/0 cable is approximately 1.25"	Include existing medium voltage pull box shown on plan in demolition scope and provide a new medium voltage path to new gear. Based on routing, where a pull box is required provide a 4'x 4' pull box and enter exit at opposing corners to also comply with bend radius of cable.
3.	There are existing mechanical utilities located over the location where the new gear is shown. This is a NEC violation. How will these be handled?	The dimensions of the new equipment are sized in such a way to avoid the chilled water piping to the right of the gear. There are several white pipes that are planned to be removed ahead of project by UK. There is also a condensate line painted orange that will be relocated ahead of projects. We expect this removes all piping above new equipment.
4.	The current bid form does not have a line item for alternates	A line item will be added to the bid form for Alternate #1
5.	Cranes will be required to get equipment in and out of the basement. SC 41.2.1 states that a 20,000,000-insurance policy is required if cranes and rigging are involved. Will this be required?	This limit of insurance will be required.
6.	It is not clear what should be included in ALT #1 VS base bid. Is all MV work to be included in the ALT #1 price? Some of the conduit and conductors on EP601 are not inside the box. Is all of the excavation, duct bank and restoration to be included under ALT #1?	Alternate #1 includes all site work required for installation of new medium voltage switch, foundation, underground duck banks and interconnected medium voltage cables. All exposed conduit and medium voltage feeder for the new MI

		King substation will be part of base bid. All temporary service connections and cable are also part of base bid.
7.	What happens if ALT#1 is not accepted?	Alternate #1 will be accepted. This is an alternate being used to separate funds used for medium voltage distribution upgrades / rework and maintenance replacement of unit substation.
8.	Will any testing be required on the temporary transformer provided by UK?	Only testing required for the temporary transformer is the secondary voltage is within acceptable ranges.
9.	What is the approximate weight of the temporary transformer?	The temporary transformers range from 5,500lb to 6,100lb.
10.	Drawing ES101 has a note to protect the temporary transformer from weather. Is the transformer outdoor rated?	All transformers being considered for temporary are oil-filled outdoor rated. All cables transitions, equipment, etc. shall be protected during construction.
11.	Will lightning arrestors be required at the temporary transformer.	Lightning Arresters shall be provided for the temporary transformer connected to the UK Medium Voltage network.
12.	I could not locate specs in the bid documents. Will these be provided?	Specifications were included with the drawings at the plan room.
13.	Project schedule is listed as 180 days for substantial completion. During the pre-bid walk thru, it was stated that this schedule starts when equipment is on site and construction starts VS contract award. Please confirm.	Substantial completion will be 180 days from delivery of the Medium Voltage equipment on the project site and confirmed by UK representative.
14.	Is there an allowance to allow utilities to be moved that hamper the installation of the new gear? The state will require a 6' minimum clearance above new electrical equipment.	The dimensions of the new equipment are sized in such a way to avoid the chilled water piping to the right of the gear. There are several white pipes that are planned to be removed ahead of project by UK. There is also a condensate line painted orange that will be relocated ahead of projects. We expect this removes all piping above new equipment.
15.	Are there any exclusions worked out with the State to allow for medium voltage services to enter the building without a disconnect means upon entry of the building?	We have contacted the State Electrical Inspector James Burt, we have reviewed the drawings with him and is accepting of the location of the main as shown in drawings. NFPA 70 Allows for this with a documented safe switching letter that we will need to provide working with the UK Medium Voltage Division.
16.	There is a Hemlock Tree located at the top of stairs next to back column leading to the Maxwell House. Is it an option to remove this tree to facilitate installing service conduits?	Hemlock tree at the top of the stairs is called for demolition per drawing ES100.
