1	The pricing form for this opportunity appears to be in the Scope of Work Excel matrix (Appendix A), line items 159-165. Can UK confirm the product descriptions and quantities are correct for this trauma registry opportunity, as they appear to relate to an ePCR offering?	For the TPO we have 7000 registry entries last year. The State data is listed as 14000 entries per year.
2	On page 7, section 2.2 of the RFP document ("Background Information"), the document describes UK HealthCare's trauma registry as having 7,000 patient records a year. The paragraph below mentions the voluntary State of Kentucky trauma system that registers about 14,000 cases per year. Can UK confirm that this RFP is meant to solicit a solution for both the UK and State of Kentucky registry?	Yes, confirmed. There are two distinct departments taking part in this RFP due to the over-lapping nature of what they are seeking.
3	Page 7, section 2.2 of the RFP document mentions the State of Kentucky voluntary trauma system includes about one-third of the state's hospitals. Can UK provide a listing of the hospitals participating in this statewide registry, their trauma level designation, and the Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system used for each?	See Table 1 below for the participating hospitals. We do not know what EMR systems they use.
4	Page 7, section 2.1 of the RFP document states the solution must comply with the ACS, NTDB, and the Kentucky Trauma Registry Data Dictionary (KTRDD). Are UK and the State of Kentucky looking to continue the current legacy data standards, or will the new solution be transitioning to staying consistent with the current national standards?	For the state data bank, we will be using the legacy standards because the data are not used for any compliance activities. To the extent that we need to modify the data dictionary to accommodate updates in facility reporting standards we will do so.  We will have to comply with new Standards to maintain Level 1 verification.
5	Page 12, section 3.6 of the RFP document outlines the hard-copy submission requirements, consisting of both a Technical Proposal document and a Financial Proposal Document. However, page 16, section 4.1 ("Proposal Information and Criteria") provides a list of sections that must be presented in the order listed, which have	Part of the requirement of the RFP response is that the technical portion of the response be separated from the financial portion. This is done to allow the responses to be reviewed in terms of their qualifications prior to reviewing the cost.

	<p>“Financial Proposal” as Criteria 3. When submitting the two hard-copy deliverables described in section 3.6, what should the “Financial Proposal” include? In other words, should the Technical Proposal document follow the order listed in section 4.1, but with the Criteria 3 Financial Proposal extracted and provided separately? Similarly, should the financial statements requested in Criteria 1 also be extracted from the Technical Proposal and only included in the sealed Financial Proposal?</p>	
6	<p>Page 32, section 7.2 of the RFP document requests “Alternate Pricing,” allowing offerors to submit alternate financial proposals. How should such alternate proposals be presented, taking into consideration the pricing section of Appendix A (line items 159-165)? Should alternate proposals include alternate/additional Appendix A documents, or just those line items 159-165?</p>	<p>Alternative pricing is up to the vendor to offer and is not required.</p>
7	<p>What are you referring to specifically when mentioning BCP?</p>	<p>A BCP format file is a file used by the Microsoft SQL Server "Bulk Copy Program (BCP)" utility to define the structure and data types of a data file,</p>
8	<p>How many Level I-III trauma centers will be doing direct data entry?</p>	<p>About 7 centers.</p>
9	<p>How many Level IV-V trauma centers will be doing direct data entry?</p>	<p>About 19 Level IV. Kentucky does not have Level V centers</p>
10	<p>Could you please confirm the number of annual trauma incidents?</p>	<p>The full statewide registry now includes some 15,000 encounters of care.</p> <p>For the TPO we have 7000 registry entries last year. Julia has state data that she listed as 14000 entries per year.</p>
