1	Is a "Neonatal" offering required for the RFP?	No, only for patients 2 years and older.
2	What % of the 35 Annual Pediatric Patients are classified as "Neonatal" vs two years and older?	Zero (0%)
3	Why wasn't Video a requirement for the RFP?	Offerors may propose additional capabilities (such as video) as part of their solution per Section 4.6
4	Please confirm whether this RFP applies only to the University of Kentucky main campus or if it extends to additional UK HealthCare facilities across the enterprise.	The resulting contract may be utilized by additional UK HealthCare facilities and affiliated locations as appropriate. Offerors should be prepared to support system-wide use consistent with the scope outlined in Section 2.1.
5	Can you confirm the stated annual volume of 199 headband/patient uses (164 adult, 35 pediatric), and provide any anticipated growth trends?	Yes, volume is correct.  There is significant interest in expanding rapid EEG to our ICUs were we currently have limited EEG technician coverage
6	How many Rapid Response EEG devices are currently in use to support the stated patient volume?	4 devices in our Emergency Departments
7	Can you provide details on your IT review and approval process for new clinical systems, including security review, integration testing, and site-specific requirements	Offerors should describe their integration, cybersecurity, and interoperability capabilities in accordance with Section 4.6

8	Is there an established IT implementation timeline, or any internal deadlines (e.g., end of an existing subscription) that the awarded vendor must meet?	Offerors are asked to provide an implementation timeline and milestones in Section 4.8.
9	What are the expectations for staff training, including number of users, required competencies, and preferred on-site vs. virtual formats?	Offerors should propose their training approach, format, and duration as outlined in Section 4.8.
10	Is there a desired maximum response or setup time for initiating EEG in emergent situations?	The RFP requires systems capable of rapid bedside EEG initiation by clinical staff (Section 2.1 and 4.6). Offerors should specify their system's setup time.
11	Assuming the references involve live interactions, can we help facilitate scheduling and coordination of these calls? And at what stage of the RFP process will these be requested?	Offerors should provide references as required in Section 4.8.
12	Can we add a section in the RFP with a designated time to review Ceribell's mission and recent product innovations (e.g., enhancements in algorithm performance, additional indications, hardware advancements)?	Offerors may include additional relevant information under Section 4.9 (Other Additional Information), provided it supports their proposal.
13	Do you plan to award the contract to a single, preferred vendor or have multiple partners?	The University reserves the right to make single, multiple, or no award as outlined in Section 3.8.
14	Outside of not discussing the RFP with any staff, are there any other rules/measures in place that we should be abiding by?	All communication must follow Section 3.12 – Restrictions on Communications, which limits contact to the Purchasing Officer during the RFP process.
